### Oh Well, We Tried .....

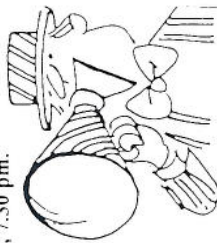

## What the Club is About

Information for new members and their parents, and answers to commonly asked questions.

The Club is administered by an executive committee, and 3 Junior and 3 Senior members, who meet on the first Monday of each month at the Clare Park Clubrooms, from February through to December (and more often when necessary). The Club is made up of 1 Masters, 1 Men's, 1 Women's, 1 Youth, 7 Junior competitive and 10 Junior non-competitive teams; as well our nursery school of 45 midgets.



The governing body is the Canterbury Junior Football Association (CJFA) who make a weekly draw, usually published in Wednesday's "Press", and the "Star" on Wednesday's or Friday's. The weekend results are usually in Monday's "Press". Points are allotted 3 for a win and 1 for a draw. CJFA cups and awards are only presented in competitive grades, with certificates in non-competitive grades.

We also belong to an extra association, Canterbury Districts, consisting of Burwood, Parklands, Rangiora and Kaiapoi. Representatives are selected from these areas from players who have not been selected for Canterbury. They play in separate tournaments. Coaches and the Junior Club Captain make nominations for both Canterbury and Districts teams. After trials, teams are announced. In recent years Burwood has produced a considerable number of representatives in both Canterbury and Districts teams which points to good coaching standards at the Club.

The midgets assemble on Saturday mornings, weather permitting, at 11.00 am. They are introduced to smaller sized balls and in a "no pressure, accent on fun" situation are taught to get the feel of the ball, shown a few basic drills and then play a game amongst themselves. From here depending on ability, potential, confidence and age they graduate to the first of non-competitive grades (8th). Boys and girls as young as 5 years sometimes play in 8th grade.

Non-competitive grades (8th to 10th) are played on Junior sized fields, with smaller goal posts and 7 players on the field at one time. The Club has 2 Junior fields and 1 Senior field at Clare Park, and 1 Senior field at Burwood Park. Occasionally coaches have, by mutual agreement, played 8, 9 or 10 a-side depending on the number of players that they carry in the team. This is actually against the CJFA rules, and can result in fines for the clubs involved. The theory of 7 a-side is that the smaller number of players on the field allow each child "more time on the ball". Both coaches are permitted on the field to coach during a game and will generally referee half a game each.

In the 11th grade, a major step is taken into "real" football - full sized fields and goalposts, and 11 players on the field. Teams are permitted to carry 14 players and play "rolling substitutes". In other words a player can enter or leave the game as often as a coach chooses. If no official referee has been assigned, then each coach will usually referee a half, and during that time is NOT permitted to coach his team.

The duration of games increases with the ages of the teams and corners are taken closer to the goal in the lower grades. Eventually full corners are taken from 14th grade.

In competitive grades, the first round of matches consists of GRADING games, and before the commencement of the second round, some teams will be moved to a different section, which better reflects their abilities.

Most coaches will make a "Player of the Day" award. This is at the discretion of the individual coach. At the end of the season the Club holds a Picnic/Prizegiving and presents CJFA and Club awards and trophies. Club certificates are presented for "Player of the Year" and "Most Improved" (some coaches will also supply and award other trophies).

Subscriptions are used by the Club to pay CJFA and Soccer NZ fees (approximately 1/2 your subs), provide club shirts, practice and match balls, corner posts, nets, clubroom maintenance, electricity, insurance, trophies and awards, Opening and Closing Day expenses etc. Some of this is subsidised by fundraising.

Cancellations are broadcast on 3ZB at 8.00, 9.00 and 10.00 am on Saturday morning. If the weather is very bad, games may be cancelled earlier (usually advertised in the "Press" during the week).

Within the constraints placed on us by a small (but enthusiastic) committee we try to provide a good standard of soccer for our players, and teach them to enjoy their sport and hopefully be a credit to themselves and the Club. We would hope that parents and supporters on the sidelines would be good role models for their kids - remember DON'T GET UGLY!
